Important NIH Details for Researchers!

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) were successful in making their **public access submission policy** mandatory. This policy will take effect April 7, 2008. This means that all investigators who are funded by NIH in whole or in part must submit their final, peer-reviewed journal articles to PubMed Central upon acceptance for publication.
